**Happy New Year Immanuel!** I'm greatly anticipating the new adventures and opportunities we have before us in the upcoming year. The good news is that in Christ Jesus we are a new creation—being transformed from one degree of glory to the next. As the people of God, we have an unlimited Source that never runs out and provides for all of our needs—the living Christ. But God always desires our participation and involvement in the work of grace that he's working in us. One of the words that describe our response to God in all aspects of our lives is stewardship. We often hear the phrase around Immanuel of good and generous stewardship of our *time, talents, and treasures*.

Sometimes it's difficult to figure out how to give of the third "T"—*treasures*. Tithing is a healthy spiritual practice to be regularly engaged in. Giving helps to exercise and grow our faith muscles. It also empowers us to live beyond ourselves so that we can bless others in Christ's name. Giving our resources is proportional to the amount we've received. All of us have received all that we have from God—but not all of us have received the same amounts. Giving is also priority #1 in the Christian's life—where we give the first-fruits to God, rather than the leftovers. When giving becomes a first thing in our lives, our lesser priorities organize themselves around giving, rather than the other way around. Giving is also a joyful, yet sacrificial act for each Jesus follower. When we give enough to feel it, we become awakened to the joy that sacrificial giving bestows upon us. We feel that we're making a difference and not just living for ourselves. I believe that we have a calling to always grow in our giving, as John Wesley famously said, "Make all you can, save all you can, give all you can." But the key is to give *from the heart*, "for God loves a cheerful giver."

In order to "save all we can" it's important to build three savings pockets. The first savings pocket is earned income. This comes from our salaries or retirement checks usually on a monthly or bi-monthly basis. The second savings pocket is capital. These are stocks, bonds, property, insurance policies, savings accounts, inheritances, or lottery winnings! These aren't a part of our regular flow of income. The third pocket is one's estate. This is what we'll leave behind when our time comes to leave this earth. I believe that it's important for us to give to God from these three pockets.

The **Immanuel Endowment Fund** is a great place to direct our estate giving. It's the gift that keeps giving—funding many of our Immanuel folks and friends of Immanuel—young and old alike—to participate in mission.

I'm excited about our guest preacher **Rev. Skip Herbert** who will be speaking on **January 30, 2011** at both services and at a luncheon afterwards. He preached a great sermon last year about "stuff" that was humorous and spiritually challenging. He'll be sharing more about giving from our three saving pockets so that we can continue to make a difference on earth—even after we've gone on to be with the Lord. I encourage all Immanuel folks to participate in worship and to sign up for the luncheon and presentation after the second service.

**Immigration**  
**Respectful Dialog about a Debatable Issue**  
**Immanuel Adult Education**  
**1/2/11 – 2/20/11**

**Facilitators: Bill Hillman, Joey Samoy and John Title,**

Immigration policy has leaped from the back pages to the front pages of newspapers in Tucson, in Arizona, and across the nation. The debates are often intensely heated and quickly move to an emotional level. Almost everyone agrees, however, that the current immigration system is not working and needs to be changed. This study seeks to provide an explanation of what is happening currently, including proposals for immigration reform. The theological and ethical views that Christians can bring to bear on policy choices, along with Presbyterian perspectives and actions will be included in the discussions. Participants will have the opportunity to view the issue from a variety of perspectives and determine what influences faith might have on individual choices and actions.

**The Spirit is Moving**

In 1993 the Rev. Jerry Stacy, San Antonio and the Rev. Saul Tijerina, from Monterrey, Mexico, representatives of Presbyterian Border Ministries, joined to survey the northwestern reaches of Mexico, where there were only a handful of churches in Ciudad Juarez and Tijuana, Mexico.

The years have passed and now Presbyterian Border Ministries is an umbrella for six ministries in McAllen, Cd, Acuña, and El Paso, all in Texas, Agua Prieta and Nogales, across the border from Arizona, and Tijuana, Mexico. In all the communities along the border Presbyterian fellowships and worshipping communities have been formed, so that now there are some thirty of them. The ones nearest to us in Arizona are part of a presbytery that has been formed, the Presbytery of Chihuahua. The presbytery now has 29 ordained ministers, lay pastors and candidates.

In November leaders of the Chihuahua Presbytery did some brainstorming and set a goal for themselves: within the foreseeable future the presbytery should divide, and form a new presbytery in the states of Sonora and Sinaloa, when five of those communities can be chartered as churches. The first target is to build up the congregation in Ciudad Obregón, beginning in 2011. The spirit of God is moving among our brothers and sisters across the border, led by Campañeros en Misión and the support of many Presbyterians in Presbytery de Cristo.

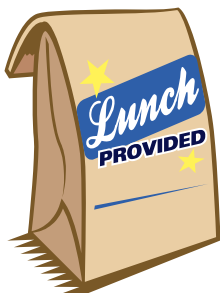
### Casa Maria

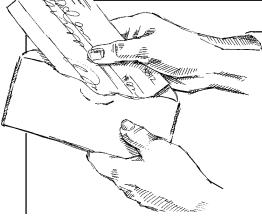


### GET READY FOR THE HARLEM GOSPEL CHOIR:

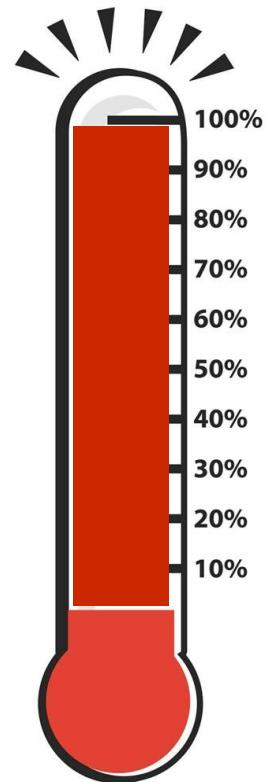

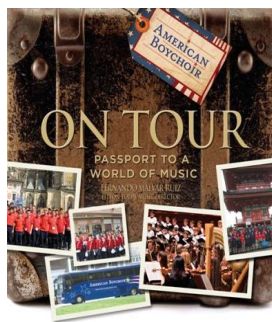
