Greetings Immanuel! Last month Session unanimously approved to start up the 8:30 Progressive Worship Service in the beginning of 2011.

This is an important decision in the life of Immanuel, so I'd like to interpret the process and what this means for our community of faith:

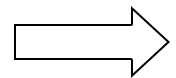
***The road to the present. . . and the future:***

We have taken our time and been very prayerful each step of the way. The worship committee has been dialoguing about a new genre of worship for over two years. Our worship services have incorporated technology for nearly two years. Session deliberated the pros and cons of a progressive worship service for several months before voting.

*“The PCUSA acknowledges that all forms of worship are provisional and subject to reformation. In ordering worship the church is to seek openness to the creativity of the Holy Spirit, who guides the church toward worship which is orderly yet spontaneous, consistent with God’s Word and open to the newness of God’s future.”*

When the time came for a vote, the session unanimously approved a progressive worship service a year ago, but not a specific morning time that it would be held. There was a Dove article dedicated to the rationale of a progressive worship service and commonly asked questions about what a service like this would entail. We then had two congregational information meetings about the progressive service in December of 2009 and had a church-wide survey that was later published in the Dove.

After much prayer, discussion, and listening to the congregation, Session voted to have the progressive worship service with technology at 8:30 am and the traditional worship service with technology at 11:00 am. Last month, session unanimously approved for the Personnel Committee to begin the search process to bring a candidate before Session to approve a part-time music worship leader in this new service. Our hope is to begin the Progressive Worship service with the right music worship leader on the first Sunday of January 2011.

**Why are we doing a progressive worship service?** The heartbeat of this new faith venture is mission. We know this service isn't a magic wand or a cure-all, but our desire is that this might be an additional way we might reach more kinds of folks and different kinds of folks with the good news of Jesus Christ. The Apostle Paul describes it this way: "I have become all things to all people, so I could save some by all possible means. All the things I do are for the sake of the gospel, so I can be a partner with it." (1 Cor. 9:22b-23 CEB).

**What is familiar about the progressive worship service?** This service will be Christ-centered, multi-generational, reformed and reforming, utilize technology, hymns, liturgy, prayers, and the same sermon theme of the traditional service. I'll preach in both services.

**What is different about the service?** The progressive service will be more informal (I won't wear a robe), band-oriented in music style, and incorporate praise songs, multi-media, and multi-sensory teaching techniques more regularly.

**Grace in the transition.** Changes in worship style are one of the biggest changes a church can make. This new endeavor will take grace, a tolerance for something emerging and different, and a good dose of humility. Real Christian unity is not found in a particular music style or certain time of worship. Rather our unity is in the person of Christ Jesus and the shared experience of the Spirit that honors and transcends our differences.

You're invited to participate in whichever service you would like—invite your pre-Christian friends too! You're free to have your own preference of music style, but remember one genre is not better than the other—they're just . . . *different*. You're also free to not have to like *everything* at Immanuel. My prayer is that I'll overhear folks saying, "You know my favorite style of worship is \_\_\_\_\_. I'm open to the style of \_\_\_\_\_, but it's not my cup of tea. But I sure am glad we have it available for folks who do like it!" The key is that God would be glorified in our worship and in all that we do and say.

We all have a part to play in this exciting time of change. May we grow closer to God, to one another, and our mission to pre-believers in Tucson through this leap of faith! We'll be sure to keep you updated on the remaining process leading up to the launch date.

Your 2010 Per Capita**

**Each Member of Immanuel was assessed a \$31.00 Per Capita Fee for 2010.**

Immigration policy has leaped from the back pages to the front pages of newspapers in Tucson, in Arizona, and across the nation. The debates are often intensely heated and quickly move to an emotional level. Almost everyone agrees, however, that the current immigration system is not working and needs to be changed. This study seeks to provide an explanation of what is happening currently, including proposals for immigration reform. The theological and ethical views that Christians can bring to bear on policy choices, along with Presbyterian perspectives and actions will be included in the discussions. Participants will have the opportunity to view the issue from a variety of perspectives and determine what influences faith might have on individual choices and actions.

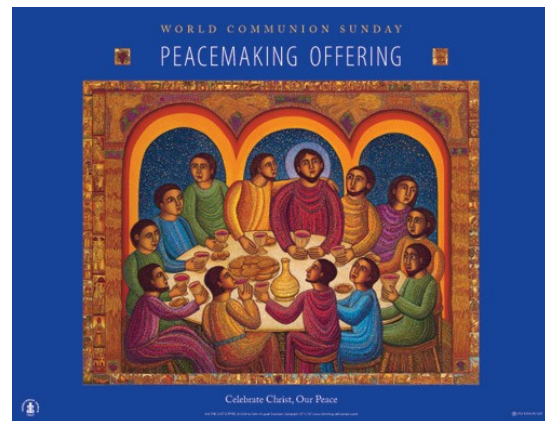

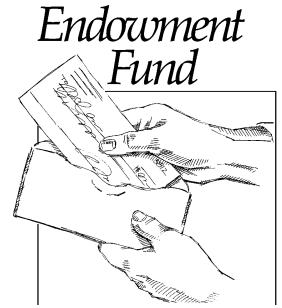

## ENDOWMENT FUND OPPORTUNITY

Many Presbyterians give as they live and make the Church a part of their financial plans. Establishing a charitable gift annuity is one way to provide a future gift to your church and receive **lifetime annuity income**. A charitable gift annuity is established with the Presbyterian Church's Foundation. This organization has been in service since 1799!



Have you checked out the current interest rates on Certificates of Deposit? They are only good for the term of the present CD and then you are subject to whatever the interest rates are in effect when you renew. Not so with a gift annuity – the rate provided at the time of creation is guaranteed for life. Annuity rates are determined by your age. The rates below are for one annuitant but a couple may establish a gift annuity as well.

### SAMPLE CHARITABLE GIFT ANNUITY RATES.

Note: Rates effective as of July 2010 -- Minimum age is 55 – Gift minimum is \$10,000

Another benefit of establishing a gift annuity is that there is normally favorable tax treatment. ## MINISTRY TO OUR NEIGHBORS

### Ancient Christianity Today



The Christian Church began appearing in the Middle East very shortly after Pentecost. As a young movement it had leaders throughout the region, but mainly in Antioch, Egypt, Syria and Byzantium. During the first centuries the Christian Church struggled against the Roman Empire. Around 315 A.D. Christianity was accepted throughout the empire. Rome and Constantinople vied for power, with theological and political forces pulling in separate directions. Finally in 1350 the Eastern Orthodox Church pulled away from Rome.

Mohammed founded Islam around 625 A.D. and a movement developed which capitalized on the disarray of the Christian church. Before long Islam had spread throughout the Middle East and North Africa. In the 12<sup>th</sup> Century Saladin came to dominate the Ottoman Empire, which by then extended even into southeastern Europe, all the way to the Austro-Hungarian Empire. Islam had become the principal religion of the Middle East, and Christian churches had to struggle to keep from disappearing.

Yet they were faithful and a number of Christian communities that exist today trace their existence through all these changes. In that environment they have found ways to cooperate, and now some 27 denominations, including the Presbyterians, the United Church of Christ, the Episcopalians and the Lutherans, constitute the Middle East Council of Churches. The Rev. Dr. Nuhad Tomeh is the regional Presbyterian liaison as well as the associate general secretary for MECC.
