

Invented in 1974, it took the inventor of Rubik's Cube (Professor Ernő Rubik) over a month to solve it.

It has been calculated that there are 43,252,003,274,489,856,000 possible permutations of the Rubik's Cube. That's 43 quintillion (43 followed by 18 zeros!) If you had 43 quintillion dollars, you can spend a trillion dollars a day for the next 118 thousand years.



If you manage to turn the Rubik's Cube once every second, it will take you 1.4 trillion years to go through all the permutations.

The world record for a human solving the Rubik's Cube is 3.47 seconds by Yusheng Du. A robot solved the Rubik's Cube in .38 seconds in 2018.

The largest Rubik's Cube ever made is a 17x17x17 cube. Kevin Hays solved it in 2 hours and 32 minutes.

The session wants your feedback on how we might solve one of Immanuel's proverbial Rubik's Cubes. It's trickier than it looks. Session has been discussing possible adjustments we might make to improve the flow of our Sunday morning schedule beginning in 2020. Nothing has been changed or voted upon yet. We want to hear from you before any changes are made to get feedback in Session's discernment process. Here are the motivations for any changes that the Session might make next year:

- 1. Have a Sunday morning schedule that does not schedule two major events at the same time (i.e. Christian Education and pre-service choir practice).
- 2. Increased amount of opportunities for those who worship at 8:30am and 11:00am to interact together between the services with Christian Education, Fellowship, and mission projects.
- 3. Through give and take, create the best Sunday morning schedule for our worship services, Christian Education, and Hospitality to thrive.
- 4. A schedule that allows hospitality volunteers and facility team members to begin to return home by 1:00 pm.

Session, staff members, and our ministry teams (particularly Worship, Christian Education, and Hospitality) have engaged in numerous discussions and made several revisions to create a possible January 2020 Sunday schedule.

CASA MARIA MINISTRY

Immanuel is one of many organizations in Tucson who regularly help to feed the hungry through donations of sack lunches to the Casa Maria Free Kitchen. Located in the Santa Rita neighborhood of South Tucson, Casa Maria feeds nearly 1,000 people every day—local residents and homeless alike. Immanuel's commitment is for 500 lunches every 4 weeks. Immanuel members prepare 350 lunches at home, and our Deacons prepare 150 at church.



Want to help make sandwiches? Each lunch should contain two meat and cheese sandwiches (please use only butter/margarine—no mayo, mustard, lettuce or tomato), a piece of fruit (such as a banana, peach, pear, or orange), and a dessert (2 cookies, 1 brownie, etc.). 


DIFFICULT TOPICS AUTHENTIC CONVERSATIONS How to turn conflict into community

Frolic Nursery helps our little ones take little steps to big faith—starting at birth through age 2. Teacher Grace Kelly, Nursery Director.





WHY: To learn more about our Presbyterian border ministry and its impact in the borderlands. Visit the border wall, the CAME migrant center, and the Café Justo coffee roaster (and sample the coffee!). Learn about FdC's street ministry and drug and alcohol rehabilitation at CRREDA; visit the women's co-op at DouglaPrieta Trabaja; and enjoy two meals and conversation over the border. This is a fairly in-depth introductory tour designed for those interested in learning more about Frontera de Cristo's work from a social justice perspective.




