Plant a Tree in 2020

"But I am like a green olive tree in the house of God. I trust in the steadfast love of God forever and ever."

Psalm 52:8

An olive tree takes about fifteen years to begin to bear fruit, but its average lifespan is 300-600 years, some trees living 1000+ years. Olive trees are green throughout the year. Time-tested olive trees are bent, gnarled, and hollow—yet they still produce fruit. The wood of an olive tree is resistant to decay. Olive trees nourish with their healing, anti-inflammatory, and antioxidant properties. Olive wood provides renewable energy—producing 2.5 times the heat of burning regular wood and its smoke is harmless. Ash from olive wood is used for fertilizing gardens. The olive tree is used symbolically for peace and healing in Scripture, literature, and history. Planting an olive tree is an investment in the future—for centuries to come, blessing us and our progeny.

Martin Luther once said, "God writes the Gospel not in the Bible alone, but also on trees, and in the flowers, and clouds and stars." We too believe there are great lessons to learn about faith, endurance, giving, and healing from the olive tree. I don't know about you, but I want to be a living olive tree! Whether you're a young sprout or a seasoned tree, God calls us to nourish others with our first fruits. We ask in this new year and new decade, that you Plant a Tree in 2020 and branch out even more in faith to reach all ages with the good news of Jesus Christ.

On **Commitment Sunday**, **January 26**, **2020** at each service, we will not only dedicate our **Plant a Tree in 2020** pledges in the sanctuary, but we will consecrate Immanuel's new olive tree outside the sanctuary. What a wonderful reminder our olive tree will be each time we set foot on the Immanuel campus of our commitment to enduring faith, and peace and healing in an age of division and woundedness. The psalmist reminds us of how we flourish in God's love, "like trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season, and their leaves do not wither. In all that they do, they prosper. (Psalm 1:3). May it be so!





It was Thanksgiving, 1993. Tracy Autler was a single mom living in an apartment and was due to have her second child any day. She was living off of welfare and food stamps. While the smells of Thanksgiving wafted through her building, Tracy cobbled together various canned foods for the meal. And then the doorbell rang. Who would be visiting on Thanksgiving Day?



Standing before her was a delivery man holding a piping hot, full course Thanksgiving meal prepared from a restaurant. He told her it was from an anonymous donor and then proceeded to leave. Overwhelmed by the act of generosity and kindness, all Tracy could do was cry tears of joy all Thanksgiving Day. She called family and friends to find out who it was. Nobody knew.

Fast forward seven years later. Tracy eventually became a nurse, moved out of her apartment, and got married. A woman named Margot who had multiple sclerosis was admitted into Tracy's care at the hospital. She then remembered that Margot lived in her old apartment complex. Three days before Margot died, she called over Tracy and whispered in her ear, "Happy Thanksgiving."

Margot's gift was a gift that inspired more gifts. From that day onward, Tracy purposed in her heart to do generous things like Margot did for her. The day she went off welfare, she came to the office to give gifts to all the welfare workers. Tracy and her husband decided to become foster parents and eventually adopted a child. To this day, Tracy is on the lookout to give to others.

Giving is a beautiful thing. It blesses the receiver and the giver. Jesus knew this long ago—it is more blessed to give, than to receive. God loves a cheerful giver. We have no idea of the impact of our gifts upon others. Giving is a lot like sowing seeds of love, goodwill, joy, affirmation, encouragement, and peace. As a giving community, we will reap the fruit of the Spirit that nourishes everyone, including ourselves.

I thank God for you Immanuel—your generous spirit, your generosity in giving, and your generosity in serving is an inspiration—bringing joy to many. And in my mind's eye, I see God smiling on us, on you. As we plan for mission and ministry at Immanuel in this new decade, I want to thank you for the difference you are making and the joy you are bringing in our calling to discover and display Christ in here and out there! 

Desert Sanctuary Restoration Project



Immanuel's Desert Sanctuary began in 2007 with the Labyrinth designed by Zachary Atwell as an Eagle Scout project for Troop 157. In 2010 and the years following, Troop 157 added the ramada and created a full circle nature trail starting across a small bridge to the right of the main path around the back of the property. Stations of the Cross were set along the path so visitors could stop for a moment to read the inspirational message posted at that station about the Lord. This is what we are in the process of restoring.

The Desert Sanctuary provides a special place for many people to seek quiet including neighbors from the surrounding community, those who stop by to walk the labyrinth and spend a few quiet moments with the Creator, and fellow parishioners who enjoy moments of quiet and personal reflection in the midst of God's creation. We have the opportunity to give them all a very special gift, a beautiful, healthy desert landscape.

And so we are ready to start again on Saturday, January 11 to build on the encouraging progress from this past fall. Already the area is more open with much of the dead cactus and broken tree branches removed along the main pathway. You can see mourning doves and bunny rabbits scurrying as you walk along the path. Thank you to our very dedicated volunteers!



Our goal is to finish removing the dead cactus and the overgrowth on both sides of the main path, ramada and labyrinth before Holy Week and Easter (April 12). We will meet for 2 hours each of these Saturdays to restore the simple beauty of the surrounding desert.










JANUARY CONNECTIONS
