Catching Up With The Radical Rabbi Sermon Series "The Radical Rabbi Who Thought He Was God" *by* Rev. John C. Tittle

Gospel Reading: John 8:48-59 NRSV

⁴⁸ The Jews answered Jesus, "Are we not right in saying that you are a Samaritan and have a demon?" ⁴⁹ He answered, "I do not have a demon; but I honor my Father, and you dishonor me. ⁵⁰ Yet I do not seek my own glory; there is one who seeks it and he is the judge. ⁵¹ Very truly, I tell you, whoever keeps my word will never see death." ⁵² The Jews said to him, "Now we know that you have a demon. Abraham died, and so did the prophets; yet you say, 'Whoever keeps my word will never taste death.' ⁵³ Are you greater than our father Abraham, who died? The prophets also died. Who do you claim to be?" ⁵⁴ Jesus answered, "If I glorify myself, my glory is nothing. It is my Father who glorifies me, he of whom you say, 'He is our God,' ⁵⁵ though you do not know him. But I know him; if I would say that I do not know him, I would be a liar like you. But I do know him and I keep his word. ⁵⁶ Your ancestor Abraham rejoiced that he would see my day; he saw it and was glad." ⁵⁷ Then the Jews said to him, "You are not yet fifty years old, and have you seen Abraham?" ⁵⁸ Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, before Abraham was, I am." ⁵⁹ So they picked up stones to throw at him, but Jesus hid himself and went out of the temple.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What jumps out at you about this passage?
- 2. What do you think of this statement: *Jesus gave us only three options to decide who he is, either a Mad Man, a Con Man, or the God Man.* Who do you say Jesus is? What evidence do you have to back up your belief?
- 3. Many people view Jesus as a great moral teacher who lived a long time ago. Why is this view of Jesus so natural and easy to accept?
- 4. The Judaeans called Jesus a Samaritan and said that he had a demon. Why is it so easy for us to demonize and resort to name-calling toward those different from us, or those who we disagree with, or those we don't understand?
- 5. What do you think of Jesus' response to their strong words and violent actions? Do you think he was guilty of name-calling too?
- 6. If someone today claimed that they were God, how would you test their claims? What would it take to believe in them?
- 7. What would it take for you to want to cast stones at someone?
- 8. How does it free us to live for God's glory and not worry about our own?
- 9. Jesus said, "before Abraham was, I am." How would you describe what he was saying in your own words?
- 10. Our Christian faith teaches that Jesus is both human and God. How does both the humanity and divinity of Christ help us?
- 11. How do you think Jesus escaped in this scene from the religious leaders who wanted to stone him?

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
