## "Then Came Jesus" by Rev. John C. Tittle

## Scripture: Matthew 3: 13-17 NRSV

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. <sup>14</sup> John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?"

<sup>15</sup> But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness." Then he consented. <sup>16</sup> And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. <sup>17</sup> And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased."

- 6. What do you think this meant to Jesus?
- 7. How does it make you feel hearing it about yourself in Christ Jesus?
- 8. How can remembering Christ's baptism and our baptism help us in challenging times?
