"Leadership and Followership" by Rev. John C. Tittle

Scripture Reading: Mark 1:4-11

⁴ John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁶ Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. ⁸ I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." ⁹ In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰ And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. ¹¹ And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What jumps out at you about this passage?
- 2. Can you think of a time where a parent or father or mother figure in your life spoke an encouraging word over you?
- 3. Aristotle once said, "he who cannot be a good follower cannot be a good leader." How do you see that principle at work in John the Baptist? In Jesus the Messiah?
- 4. Do you think it was hard for John the Baptist to transition from people coming to see him to people coming to see Jesus instead?
- 5. What did John the Baptist see in Jesus that was different than him?
- 6. If Jesus was without sin, why do you think he was baptized?
- 7. How would you define the word repentance? Do you think it is appropriate for Presbyterians to call for repentance?
- 8. Why do you think God affirmed Jesus at this point in his life? Why did he use both visual and verbal means to do this?
- 9. After the Spirit descended upon Jesus like a dove, he was sent out to the desert to be tempted. Why would the Spirit ever do that, isn't that leading us into temptation?
