Call to Confession 1 John 1: 5-7

But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.

One: Remind us that we are dependent on one another. Show us we are to be concerned for all people. Teach us to love one another.

All: Teach us the joy of sharing, Lord.

One: We ask for power, guidance, and direction as your people on a holy mission. As the community of faith, may we be faithful to the call to spread Christ's love, care, and concern to all people.

All: Give us a loving heart and willing spirit, Lord. Amen.

Philip said to him, "Come and see." <sup>47</sup> When Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him, he said of him, "Here is truly an Israelite in whom there is no deceit!" <sup>48</sup> Nathanael asked him, "Where did you get to know me?"
