

PRAYER OF ADORATION

*CALL TO WORSHIP Psalm 139

One: O Lord, you have searched me and known me.

All: You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away.

One: You search out my path and my lying down and are acquainted with all my ways.

All: Even before a word is on my tongue, O Lord, you know it completely.

One: Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is so high that I cannot attain it.

All: For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb.

One: I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; that I know very well.

All: How weighty to me are your thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them!

One: I try to count them—they are more than the sand;

All: I come to the end —I am still with you.

One: Let us worship the living God!

CALL TO CONFESSION 1 John 1: 5-7

One: This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. If we claim to have fellowship with him yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.

One: Empower us with gifts and desire, gracious God, to minister with your people.

All: Bless and guide us, O Lord.

One: Lord, we often boast that we are "one people under God," yet we are divided by strife and factions with the sin of disunity spreading among us like a disease. We are unable to measure up to our standards, much less to yours.

All: Forgive us, Lord.

One: Cleanse us and make us whole. Renew our minds and motives so that we might be your people, acceptable in your sight.

All: We seek your guidance, Lord.

One: The tensions and differences of race, traditions, culture, creed, and language consume and alienate us. Come among us, O God, and free us to live creatively, worship openly, and love unconditionally.

All: Forgive our arrogance, Lord.

One: Help us to remember that to bear the good news to others means to first live the good news among ourselves.

All: We seek boldness, Lord.

One: Remind us that we are dependent on one another. Show us we are to be concerned for all people. Teach us to love one another.

All: Teach us the joy of sharing, Lord.

One: We ask for power, guidance, and direction as your people on a holy mission. As the community of faith, may we be faithful to the call to spread Christ's love, care, and concern to all people.


All: Give us a loving heart and willing spirit, Lord. Amen.

MOMENT OF SILENT PRAYER


ASSURANCE OF FORGIVENESS

GOSPEL READING


John 1: 43-51 NRSVue

⁴³ The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me." ⁴⁴ Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. ⁴⁵ Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found him about whom Moses in the Law and also the Prophets wrote, Jesus son of Joseph from Nazareth." ⁴⁶ Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." ⁴⁷ When Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him, he said of him, "Here is truly an Israelite in whom there is no deceit!" ⁴⁸ Nathanael asked him, "Where did you get to know me?" Jesus answered, "I saw you under the fig tree before Philip called you." ⁴⁹ Nathanael replied, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" ⁵⁰ Jesus answered, "Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? You will see greater things than these." ⁵¹ And he said to him, "Very truly, I tell you, you will see heaven opened and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man."
