"He Leadeth Us" by Rev. John C. Tittle

Scripture Reading: Psalm 23

¹The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. ² He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters. ³ He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake. ⁴ Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me. ⁵ Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over. ⁶ Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What are some of your favorite phrases in this passage? Did you ever have to memorize this as a child?
- 2. How has this particular psalm helped you in your faith and life?
- 3. How could this psalm help us in the midst of a pandemic and the turmoil in our nation?
- 4. Why do you think Psalm 23 is probably the most loved and most known passages in all the Bible?
- 5. How might this psalm speak to all the seasons of our lives—the good times, the mundane times, and the difficult times?
- 6. How is God like a shepherd? How are we like sheep?
 - a. Read Luke 15:3-7
 - b. Read 1 Peter 2:21-25 How does Christ mix the metaphors?
- 7. If God is with us through all of life's difficulties—rather than always sparing us from life's difficulties—why should we trust God?
- 8. Grammatical Questions:
- a. Do you think this psalm is speaking to the present? To the future? To both tenses?
- b. There's a change in the imagery David uses for God midway through the psalm. Do you what it might be?
