

PRAYER OF ADORATION

*CALL TO WORSHIP Adapted from Psalm 22

One: You who fear the Lord, praise and revere him!

All: For he has not despised or scorned the suffering of the afflicted one; he has not hidden his face from him but has listened to his cry for help.

One: From you comes the theme of my praise in the great assembly; before those who fear you I will fulfill my vows.

All: The poor will eat and be satisfied; those who seek the Lord will praise him—may your hearts live forever!

One: All the ends of the earth will remember and turn to the Lord, and all the families of the nations will bow down before him,

All: All the rich of the earth will feast and worship; all who go down to the dust will kneel before him.

One: Posterity will serve him; future generations will be told about the Lord.

All: They will proclaim his righteousness, declaring to a people yet unborn: He has done it!

CALL TO CONFESSION Isaiah 58

One: The Lord speaks through the Prophet Isaiah: Is not this the fast I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice; to share your bread with the hungry; to bring the homeless poor into your house; to clothe the naked? Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your healing shall spring up quickly. Having heard these promises, let us confess our sins.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

All: God of mercy, your Son Jesus Christ longs to gather us in the wide embrace of his love. Yet we confess that we have often walked past Christ's extended arms and lived life on our own as prodigal daughters and sons. Like wayward children, we have disobeyed your commands; our ears have been deaf to your call; our hearts

have been cold to your love. In thought, in word, and in action we have hurt others and dishonored your name. In your great mercy receive us yet again as your well-beloved children, not because we are worthy but for the sake of him who loved us and gave himself for us. Amen.


MOMENT OF SILENT PRAYER

Romans 4

GOSPEL READING

Mark 8: 31-38 NRSVue

³¹ Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes and be killed and after three days rise again. ³² He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. ³³ But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."

³⁴ He called the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "If any wish to come after me, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ³⁵ For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. ³⁶ For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? ³⁷ Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? ³⁸ Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."

*AFFIRMATION OF FAITH
