## "Giving 101: Giving with All Your Mite" by Rev. John C. Tittle

## Scripture Reading: Mark 12:41-44 KJV

<sup>41</sup> And Jesus sat over against the treasury, and beheld how the people cast money into the treasury: and many that were rich cast in much. <sup>42</sup> And there came a certain poor widow, and she threw in two mites, which make a farthing. <sup>43</sup> And he called unto him his disciples, and saith unto them, Verily I say unto you, That this poor widow hath cast more in, than all they which have cast into the treasury: <sup>44</sup> For all they did cast in of their abundance; but she of her want did cast in all that she had, even all her living.

## Discussion Questions:

- 1. What jumps out at you about this passage?
- 2. What's the most sacrificial gift you've ever given? What's the biggest gift you've ever received?
- 3. Jesus is not a participant in this passage, he's an observer, a people watcher. What do you think Jesus noticed beyond the poor widow and her gift?
- 4. Why do you think Jesus chose a poor widow to be Christianity's paragon of giving?
- 5. The sermon mentioned that this passage isn't so much about how much one gives by the heart and attitude behind the giving. Do you agree or disagree? Why?
- 6. Why do you think in this scene and in this moment Jesus said to the disciples, "Verily I say unto you..." (i.e. AMEN AMEN I say unto you)?
- 7. The poor old widow obviously gave less, yet Jesus said she gave more than those who gave out of their abundance. How is this possible?
- 8. What does it mean for us today to cast into the offering box "all of our living?"
