*CALL TO WORSHIP

adapted from Psalm 69

One: Save me, O God, for I am weary with my crying; my throat is parched. My eyes grow dim with waiting for my God.

All: More in number than the hairs of my head are those who hate me without cause. It is for your sake that I have borne reproach, that shame has covered my face.

One: It is zeal for your house that has consumed me; the insults of those who insult you have fallen on me.

All: Answer me, O Lord, for your steadfast love is good; according to your abundant mercy, turn to me.

One: Draw near to me, redeem me, set me free because of my enemies.

CALL TO CONFESSION

Psalm 51

One: The sacrifice acceptable to God is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise. In humility, let us confess our sin to God.

GUIDED PRAYER OF EXAMEN

One: Blessed are the poor in spirit.

Silent Reflection: Am I humble enough to acknowledge my total dependence on God? Am I able to admit that I don't have all the answers? Can I admit mistakes without blaming others?

One: Blessed are those who mourn.

Silent Reflection: Do I stop to examine my losses, or do I miss the opportunity to be closer to God? Do I take my broken promises to God? Do I turn to God when facing death or loss of a loved one?

One: Blessed are the meek.

Silent Reflection: Do I align my desires with God's will? Do I serve my neighbors? Even the ungrateful ones? The people I don't like? Or the unlikeable? Am I able to affirm others rather than criticize them? Am I a good listener?

One: Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness.

Silent Reflection: Do I yearn for God's kingdom or for material goods? Do I work for the triumph of love, peace and justice? Am I hungry for God's Word and holy communion?

One: Blessed are the merciful.

Silent Reflection: Do I choose to forgive or do I hold a grudge? Do I forgive the unforgivable? Do I give others the benefit of the doubt? Am I sensitive to others' needs?

One: Blessed are the pure of heart.

Silent Reflection: Am I a person of integrity and sincerity? Am I honest about my own faults and failings? Do I do what is truly right or do I compromise because it's easier? Do I look for instant gratification? Do I keep myself pure in mind, body, and soul? Have I allowed a particular sin or vice to distract me from God?

One: Blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be called children of God.

Silent Reflection: Am I a person of reconciliation, peace and mercy? Do I hold grudges or seek revenge? Am I at peace with myself, with my family, friends, and those with whom I live and work? Do I bring peace to my world?

One: Blessed are those who are persecuted for the sake of justice Silent Reflection: Do I examine myself and my conduct in light of the Gospel call to be a disciple? Do I follow Christ's example and stand up for what is right? Am I only a Christian when it is convenient for me, or socially acceptable? Am I able to suffer in silence or am I always complaining about something?

ASSURANCE OF FORGIVENESS

One: Hear the good news: Who is in a position to condemn? Only Christ, and Christ died for us, Christ rose for us, Christ reigns in power for us, Christ prays for us. Christ sends us. Anyone who is in Christ is a new creation. The old life has gone; a new life has begun. Brothers and sisters, you are forgiven and accepted—be at peace.

All: Thanks be to God!
