## "Trust Psalms" *by* Rev. John C. Tittle

## Scripture Reading: Psalm 62 NRSV

<sup>1</sup>For God alone my soul waits in silence; from him comes my salvation. <sup>2</sup> He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall never be shaken. <sup>3</sup> How long will you assail a person, will you batter your victim, all of you, as you would a leaning wall, a tottering fence? <sup>4</sup> Their only plan is to bring down a person of prominence. They take pleasure in falsehood; they bless with their mouths, but inwardly they curse. <sup>5</sup> For God alone my soul waits in silence, for my hope is from him. <sup>6</sup> He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be shaken. <sup>7</sup> On God rests my deliverance and my honor; my mighty rock, my refuge is in God. <sup>8</sup> Trust in him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before him; God is a refuge for us. <sup>9</sup> Those of low estate are but a breath, those of high estate are a delusion; in the balances they go up; they are together lighter than a breath. <sup>10</sup> Put no confidence in extortion, and set no vain hopes on robbery; if riches increase, do not set your heart on them. <sup>11</sup> Once God has spoken; twice have I heard this: that power belongs to God, <sup>12</sup> and steadfast love belongs to you, O Lord. For you repay to all according to their work.

## **Discussion Questions:**

- 1. What jumps out at you about this psalm?
- 2. "For God alone by soul waits in silence." Do you like silence? What do you like or don't like about it?
- 3. David is the author of this psalm and he is actively being pursued by enemies. What are some things that he says and does to find help in a time of need?
- 4. David says, "those of low estate are but a breath and those of high estate are a delusion." How does God help us have a proper view of the influence of people in our lives?
- 5. J.R.R. Tolkien once shared that the Greek word *katastrophe* means "a sudden turn." In English the word catastrophe means "a sudden turn for the worse." But when we're in a state of trust (he calls it enchantment), our catastrophes can be seen as a "eucatastrophe," which means a "good catastrophe." A sudden turn--a joyous turn where we experience sudden and miraculous grace. Have you ever experienced a eucatastrophe before?
- 6. What's the difference between being content and being complacent?
- 7. The psalm concludes with two truths about God. What are they? What are your two most important truths about God?
