Scripture Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:27-31 NRSV

²⁷ ...God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; ²⁸ God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are, ²⁹ so that no one might boast in the presence of God. ³⁰ He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption, ³¹ in order that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What jumps out at you about this passage?
- 2. The sermon talks about "breaking on the floor" in debates, meaning that in the middle of a debate, you change your mind. Have you ever had a major change of heart or change of mind where you were "broken on the floor"?
- 3. What do you find most incredible and astounding about Christianity? Have we gotten too comfortable with how "foolish" it is?
- 4. Is Paul saying that Christianity is irrational? Why or why not?
- 5. Is Paul saying that Christians shouldn't learn? What is he getting at here?
- 6. In this chapter Paul says that the crucified Christ is the wisdom of God and power of God.
- 7. How is the cross both wise and powerful, when it seems so weak?
- 8. How would you personally define human wisdom? How would you define divine wisdom?
- 9. Why is boasting and arrogance so antithetical to Christianity? Why is it so easy to become boastful and arrogant?
- 10. How can we practice the importance of being foolish more often? How will it change how we see and live our lives?
