This Week's Sermon/Bible Study Questions -

- Shepherds were poor, lower-class people in their society, at times despised by religious Jews because their work kept them away from many religious activities. Looking at verses 8-14, why do you think God chose shepherds to be the first ones to hear the good news of the birth of Jesus?
- After the angels leave, in verses 15-16, what do the shepherds do? What have they become?
- What is the shepherds' first act after seeing and experiencing Jesus (verse 17)? Think back to the time when you experienced good news in your life. Did you want to tell others about the good thing?
- If we truly experience Jesus in our lives, and thus become "witnesses" to his truth as the shepherds were, how might we do practice this in Advent and Christmas?
- Put yourself into the passage. What feelings did the shepherds experience? Note that the shepherds left glorifying and praising God (verse 20). Is there anything in your life or experience right now for which you can praise God? Is there anything you are thankful for?

Sanctuary Liturgical Colors and Decorations – This year our Christmas tree has returned! Thank you to everyone who helped decorate our sanctuary and campus for Advent. Several years ago, the Worship Team decided to decorate the sanctuary with the seasonal liturgical colors as a way to enhance the visual appreciation of worship. Royal blue is used for the season of Advent (December 3-December 24). Blue has been adopted in recent years by the PCUSA as an option for Advent because it represents the hopefulness and royalty that is anticipated in the birth of Jesus. The outside of the church is decorated with burlap wreaths symbolizing the rustic nature of the stable with flowers and ribbons in the royal blue. The decorations will remain up until after Epiphany (Three Kings Day). The color purple is considered to be a more somber color and is used for the solemnity of the Lenten season. White and gold symbolize days of joy (Christmas and Easter). Red represents the Holy Spirit (Pentecost). Green is used for the

remainder of the church year.

The Nativity scene that is on the table near the tech booth was a gift from former long-time Immanuel member Phyllis Dean. The outdoor Nativity figures located in the planter on the patio was a gift from the Snodgrass family.

The Origin of the Word Chrismon - The word "Chrismon" is a combination of the words "Christ" and "monogram." The word Chrismon has been adopted to refer to special Christmas tree ornaments. Chrismons were first developed in 1957 by Frances Spencer and the women of the Ascension Lutheran Church of Danville, Virginia. Spencer thought that the traditional, brightly colored Christmas ornaments were not fitting for a worship setting, so she started thinking about a way to reflect Christ's birth through ornaments. Through the years, the designs of the Chrismons have been extended beyond the Nativity to represent other symbols of Christianity. Next to the tree is a notebook that explains the meaning of all the Chrismons.
